#### IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR THOSE PARTICIPANTS IN THE SATURDAY NIGHT ENTERTAINMENT PROGRAM:

#### THE RULES FOR THOSE SHOWING IN THE GAIG CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES AND WISHING TO ALSO DO AN EXHIBITION RIDE ON SATURDAY NIGHT ENTERTAINMENT

These are not suggestions, nor are they informal guidelines. If they are not followed, the USDF can, and most certainly will, disqualify the horse and rider from the Regional Championships, with resulting ineligibility for the USDF Dressage Finals.

- 1. Only one person can ride the horse during the show. NO ONE else may ride the horse, even in the exhibition class (this only applies to those riding in the GAIG classes Horses only showing in SWDC classes or only in the open show can have a different rider). Applies to ALL horses at the show (GAIG, SWDC and open show!)**
- 2. You MAY NOT ride your competition freestyle in the exhibition class.**
- 3. Costumes are allowed, but all riders must wear an approved helmet and appropriate footwear for riding.**
- 4. Bareback rides and/or bridle-less rides are not allowed.**
- 5. DO NOT ride an exhibition ride that is more than one contiguous level above or below the level you are riding in the show. For example, if you are showing in training level do not come out and do an exhibition ride with second level or higher moves. For our FEI level riders, also remember that I-1 and I-2 are NOT contiguous levels.**
- 6. All tack must be USEF legal and appropriate for the level you are showing at in the champs. Please don't ride an exhibition routine in a double bridle If your show competition classes require a snaffle.**
- 7. Pay attention to the number of classes you ride on Saturday. Horses may not be ridden more than three times in National Level classes or more than two times in FEI Level classes. The exhibition rides are listed in the Prize List and count as a class.**
- 8. All horses must wear their bridle numbers at all times.**

We want the show to be fun and entertaining, but we don't want anyone disqualified due to riding in the exhibition class (and, yes, it has happened before). Pay attention to the rules, and if you're not sure, ASK!!! The USDF, USEF and HDS will not be responsible for any disqualifications that result from not following the rules during the exhibition
